

REPORTING INAPPROPRIATE CONDUCT



As a student at our School, you have the right to be protected from inappropriate behaviours by any person associated with the School. This includes staff, volunteers and other young people.



What is inappropriate?

If someone:

- Says something that makes you feel uncomfortable
- Touches you in a way that makes you feel uncomfortable
- Someone does anything else to you that you think is wrong

VS

What isn't inappropriate?

- Staff raising their voice to attract attention or restore order
- Comforting a young person after an injury or first aid
- Something accidental



HOW do I report inappropriate conduct?

To any staff member who you feel comfortable speaking **OR** to student protection contacts



WHAT will happen when I say something?

If you tell a staff member about behaviour that you think is inappropriate, they will do something about it. It doesn't matter if the behaviour is by another staff member, a student or anyone else.

It's not about getting anyone in trouble - it's about ensuring your safety!



Q & A's

Q. Will I get into trouble?

A. If you say something because you think someone did something wrong or inappropriate, you will NOT get into trouble.



Q. What happens next?

A. After you have said something to a staff member, they will do something about it. They won't tell other students what you have told them, but they might need to ask some further questions.

Q. What if i'm worried about something different?

A. If something else is worrying you, you should talk to someone who you trust about it.
